



#### How much of the Constitution do you understand?




#### How much of the Constitution have you read?








# Does the Constitution still work, or is it time for a new Constitution?




# On a day-to-day basis, how much would you say the Constitution affects you?




## How often do you vote?

# A person can be a good citizen even if s/he chooses not to vote.




## Why do you vote?





#### What is the source of governmental authority?




#### Are elected officials in Washington accountable to the voters?




## Does separation of powers favor the states or the federal government?






